<b>100</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Will Smith's character in The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air was born and raised in this neighborhood.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is West Philadelphia?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>200</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This catchphrase used as a greeting and battle cry from Marvel's Black Panther film starring Chadwick Boseman has grown in meaning to many, and is often seen as an acknowledgement of Black excellence around the world.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is "WAKANDA FOREVER"?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>300</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This comedian turned horror movie writer and director received critical acclaim for both his 2017 film "Get Out" and his 2019 film "Us."<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: Who is Jordan Peele?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>400</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• In 2002, this actress was the first Black woman to receive an Academy Award for her role in Monster's Ball.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: Who is Halle Berry?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>500</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This TV show centered around twins who were separated at birth, each adopted by a different parent.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is Sister, Sister?</li></ul></li></ul>

100	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The stage name for the artist Montero Lamar Hill who released the 2021 song Montero (Call Me By Your Name).<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Lil Nas X?</li></ul></li></ul>
200	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This 24-year-old rapper coined the term “Hot Girl Summer.”<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Megan Thee Stallion?</li></ul></li></ul>
300	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This genre of music originated in Black American communities in the 1940s and is often credited as being one of the largest inspirations for the Hip-Hop genre we know today.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: What is R&amp;B or Rhythm and Blues?</li></ul></li></ul>
400	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This 2016 album by a 28-time Grammy winning artist doubles as a refreshing drink.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: What is Lemonade?</li></ul></li></ul>
500	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This song by J. Rosamond Johnson and James Weldon Johnson is known as the “Black National Anthem.”<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: What is “Lift Every Voice and Sing”?</li></ul></li></ul>

## sports

100	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This gymnast has 7 Olympic medals and recently made headlines for opening up about the importance of taking care of yourself and putting your mental health first.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Simone Biles?</li></ul></li></ul>
200	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In 2016, this former NFL athlete began taking a knee during the National Anthem as a form of peaceful protest against police treatment of Black Americans.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Colin Kaepernick?</li></ul></li></ul>
300	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Along with holding the record for most hard-court Grand Slam singles titles, this tennis player has also been outspoken about improving maternity care in America for Black women.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Serena Williams?</li></ul></li></ul>
400	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This four-time NBA Champion and worldwide celebrity holds the record for all-time playoff points.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is LeBron James?</li></ul></li></ul>
500	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Born Cassius Clay Jr., this professional boxer who fought in the 1960s-1980s and earned the nickname “The Greatest,” changed his name to this after saying that he accepted the teachings of the Nation of Islam.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>ANSWER: Who is Muhammad Ali?</li></ul></li></ul>

## for the culture

<b>100</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The process that typically involves using gel/control, water and a toothbrush to slick down baby hairs.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is “laying edges/slaying edges”?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>200</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Popular phrases like “no cap,” “finna,” and “period” actually originated from this English dialect/language variation.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is “AAVE or African American Vernacular English”?</li><li>◦ Note: AAVE is how linguists describe the distinct way of speaking that some Black Americans have. It is not simply “slang,” but instead a language variation/dialect with its own grammatical rules, structure, and rich history.</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>300</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A silk-like material worn around the head to give the appearance of “waves.”<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is a Du-Rag?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>400</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A kickback, party, reunion, or any event that involves people “getting together.”<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What is “a function”?</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>500</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• These are NOT what the name suggests - they are small, coiled buns secured against the side of the head.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ ANSWER: What are “Bantu Knots”?</li></ul></li></ul>
